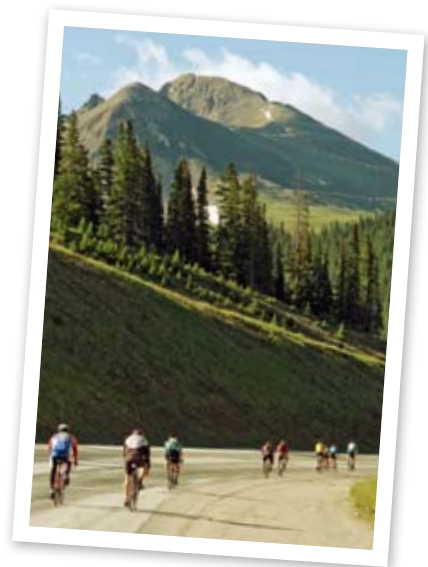

Rules of the Road

Safety is No. 1 on the Courage Classic. Please help us keep the Tour one of the safest charity rides in Colorado by following these essential rules:

1. If you're on your bike, you must wear your helmet. *NO EXCEPTIONS.*
2. Carry ID and important medical information, such as medical conditions requiring special treatment and drug allergies.
3. Ride single file on the right side of the road. This is state law.
4. Warn other cyclists when passing on the left by calling, "On your left."
5. Pull off the road completely when you stop. Linger on the shoulder, especially at aid stations, causes hazards for riders and drivers.
6. Do not cross double-yellow lines.
7. Obey all stop signs, traffic signals and warning signs. Signal your turns. Rules of the Colorado Motor Vehicle Code will be enforced.
8. For your safety, please do not use headphones while riding.
9. Share the road!

Should someone need to reach you during the Tour, they can leave a message on the Courage Classic Emergency Line: 720.777.7499. We will monitor this message box frequently, beginning at noon on Fri., July 25, and concluding at 4 pm on Mon., July 28.

We will post messages at the Tour Information Center (*see next column for locations*). We will also read the names of riders with emergency messages over the PA system during dinner each night.

Tour Information Center

You'll find the volunteer-staffed Tour Information Center near the Start/Finish Line each day. Get your questions answered, buy Tour merchandise such as socks, jerseys, visors and water bottles, buy meal tickets and check the Tour message center. Also, this is the place to check for lost luggage. The Tour Information Center will be open from the start of breakfast to the end of dinner each day.

Rider Wristband and Bike Number

Your rider wristband, which you'll receive at Tour check-in, acts as your Tour ID, your meal ticket (*if you bought a Meal Plan*) and your shower pass (*if you're camping*). Please wear it for the duration of the Tour.

In addition to your rider wristband, you will receive a bike number that must be on your bike while you are at the Tour.

Your bike number will be required while you ride. In case of emergency, we will be able to match your rider wristband number and your bike number. Or if you use our sag wagon service, your bike will be easier to identify.

Tour Photos

Each day, Sundance Images photographers will be taking shots along the Tour course and at the Finish Line. Be sure to stop by the photography tent in Burning Stones Plaza to view and order your pictures. Photos will also be available online in early August. Check your email around then for more information.

Back Country Images will be taking team photos throughout the weekend. Check with your team captain for your team photo time.

ON-COURSE RIDER SERVICES

Sag Wagons

If you (*and your bike*) need a lift up a hill, to the next aid station or to the daily finish, we will have several "sag wagons" on the course each day to take you there. Sag wagons are large vans with bike racks on the top and a sag

wagon sign in the window. To catch a sag wagon, you will need to be on a road (*versus a bike path*); your route map will help you identify the best places to find one. Pull over to a safe spot and flag down the driver. NOTE: Riders with trailers and tandem bikes may have a longer wait for a sag wagon due to space limitations. If you are riding with a child who still needs a car seat, you will be required to wait for our special sag van outfitted with various sizes of car seats.



Bicycle Service

Mechanics from bike shops across Colorado are available to help you fix mechanical problems. They will have tubes, tires, brake parts, chains, spokes, derailleurs, freewheels, spare wheels and other parts on hand. Look for them at each morning's Start Line and at each aid station. Mechanics will provide service and inexpensive parts for free. You'll be charged for more expensive parts, but you can arrange to pay at the end of the day. Be sure to thank your mechanic for supporting The Children's Hospital Courage Classic!

Medical Service

If you feel dizzy, sore, excessively tired or have an injury, our medical volunteers are available at all aid stations, along the route as biking medics and at the Finish Line until 6 pm. They'll be able to offer basic services, bandages and other first-aid items. They will also be in contact with emergency medical services for more severe injuries. If you need acetaminophen or ibuprofen, please bring it with you on your ride or be prepared to sign a release at the aid station.



Aid Stations

Aid stations and water stops are located throughout the day's route. Check your route map for exact locations. Be sure to stop, get a snack and refill your water bottles with water or sports drink. Each aid station is staffed by volunteers handing out food and drinks, a medical team and a mechanical team. You'll also find bathrooms here.

OFF-COURSE RIDER SERVICES

Copper Mountain Resort Lodging Check-in

As a courtesy, Copper Mountain is arranging for early rider lodging check-in on Fri., July 25. You'll pick up your room key and parking pass. Your room will be ready at 4 pm (*and possibly earlier!*). In the meantime, you can park, check in to the Tour at The EDGE Building and check out the entertainment in Burning Stones Plaza located near the base of the mountains in the Village.

Luggage Delivery Service

If you camp at Lake County High School on Friday night or check in to the Tour on Sat., July 26, at the Lake County High School Start Line, we will deliver your bags and camping gear to Copper Mountain Resort lodging, including the campground at The EDGE Building. You must drop your bags at the designated spot by 8:30 am on Saturday or they may be left behind. Look for the big trucks. We expect that bags will be delivered by 2 pm. Please note: There is no luggage transfer on Sunday. Please be sure to mark your luggage with your name, address, contact phone number and rider number. We'll also tag your luggage.

On Monday morning, make sure to leave your tagged luggage at the designated spot (*you'll get the location at check-in*) by 8:30 am. If it's not there by 8:30 am, it could be left behind. We'll deliver your bags to the Lake County High School Finish Line.

If you can't find your bags, check the Tour Information Center, located near the Start/Finish Line. Or, call the Tour Road Office at 970.968.2882.

Shuttles

Shuttle service will begin at 5 am and run until 7 pm (Saturday, Sunday and Monday) between the Alpine Lot and the EDGE. Shuttles will run every 15 minutes.

Massage

For just \$30, you can receive a 30-minute professional sports massage from Movement Oriented Bodywork. A portion of your massage price will be donated to Children's. Massage times book quickly, so be sure to make an appointment. You'll find the therapists in the Copper Conference Center, Ptarmigan rooms on Saturday and Sunday, and at Lake County High School on Monday.

Camping

Camping is available at Lake County High School and Copper Mountain on Friday night, and at Copper Mountain Resort on Saturday and Sunday nights. At Copper Mountain, camping is located at The EDGE Building and around the Chapel lot. RV parking is available in the Alpine lot, 1st left upon entering Copper main entrance (*no hookups*).

Please remember the following rules in the campsite:

1. NO PETS
2. No littering; pack it in and pack it out please
3. No alcoholic beverages
4. No campfires
5. Keep noise levels low in early morning and the evening
6. Be courteous about your space; please leave room for other campers
7. Be aware of sprinkler heads when deciding where to pitch your tent

Showers for Campers

Campers will have access to showers at Leadville on Sat. July 26 from 5:30 to 9:30 am and Mon. July 28 from 10 am to 4:30 pm with additional access to pay showers and pool at Leadville Recreation Center.

Campers will have access to showers at Copper Mountain Resort at The EDGE on Sat. July 26 from 1 to 6 pm, Sun. July 27 from 6 to 9 am and 1 to 6 pm and Mon. July 28 from 6 to 9 am.

Please remember:

1. Your Courage Classic camper wristband is your shower ticket
2. Bring your own toiletries and towels
3. Be courteous with the time you spend so your fellow campers can get a shower too



Meals

Your registration fee includes on-course lunches and the Finish Line BBQ. If you purchased individual meals or a Meal Plan during registration, your rider wristband or meal tickets (*you'll get them at Check-in*) are your entry into the Tour Dining area at Jack's. You can purchase Meal Plans and meal tickets for riders and non-riders at the Tour Info Center. Meal Plans are \$65/adults and \$50/kids under 16. Meal tickets are \$15 each. On-course lunches are for registered riders only.

Meals are served at Jack's Slopeside Grill, located in Copper Mountain Village Burning Stones Plaza at the base of the mountain across from the large white tent.
